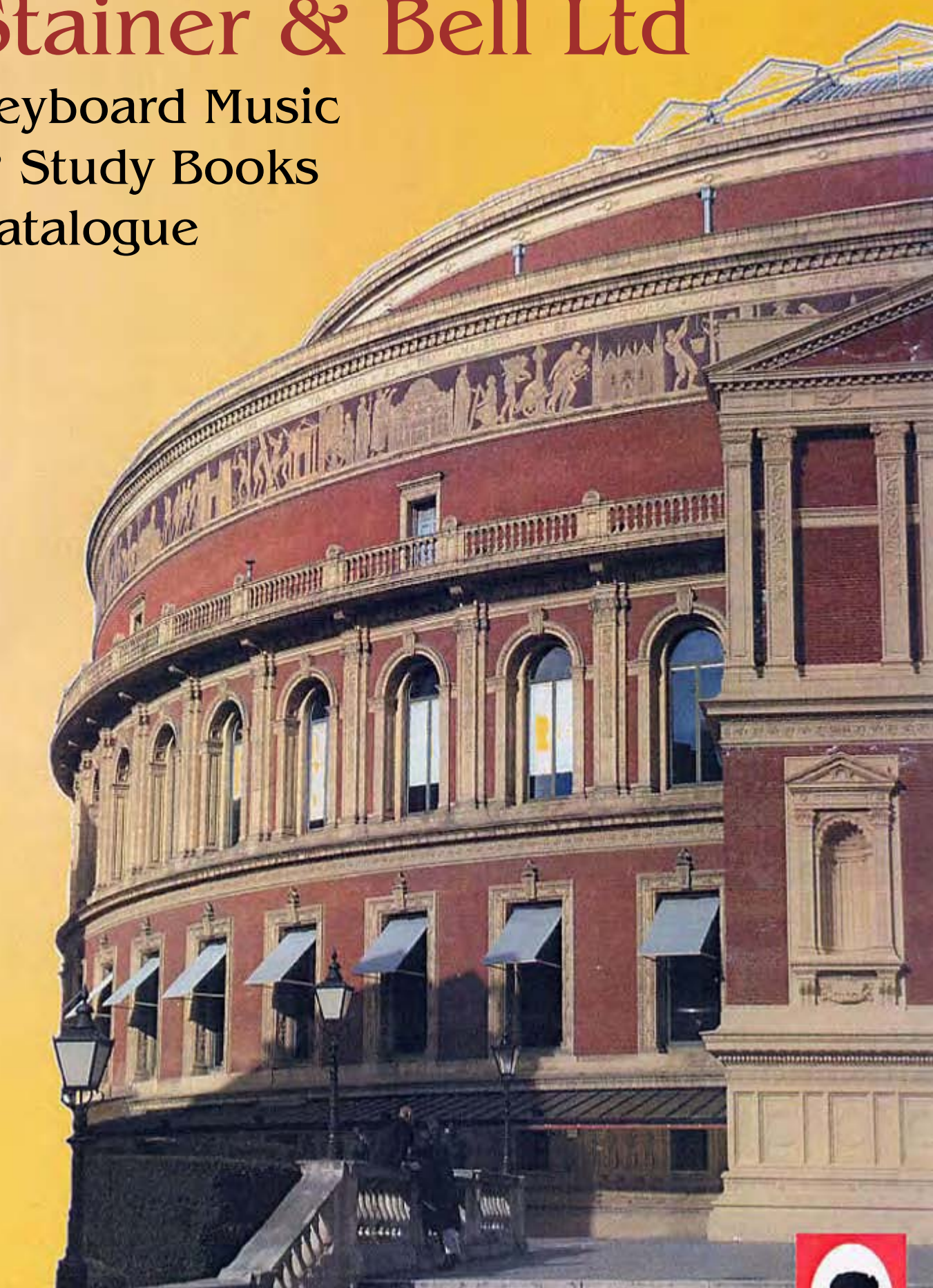

Clement Matchett's Virginal Book CON 104 K9 £6.80
 Edited by Thurston Dart. A transcription of the ms. Panmure 9 in the National Library of Scotland, with keyboard pieces by Byrd, Bull and (?) Wilbye in the hand of Matchett c.1612.

Early Scottish Keyboard Music CON 105 K15 £7.75
 Edited by Kenneth Elliott. A transcription of the ms. Panmure 10 in the National Library of Scotland, known as 'Duncan Burnett's Book' c.1610. 10 keyboard pieces by William Kinloch, Duncan Burnett and others, together with a short selection of Scots airs for cittern and for violin.

Elizabethan Keyboard Music ASK 108 MB55 £92.00
 Edited as *Musica Britannica* Volume 55 by Alan Brown. 60 pieces of music written and transcriptions made in the last quarter of the 16th century taken mostly from BL Add. MS 30485 and Will. Forster's Virginal Book.

English Keyboard Music c.1600–1625 ASK 138 MB96 £95.00
 Edited as *Musica Britannica* Volume 96 by Alan Brown. This volume is the first of two intended to extend the coverage of keyboard music in *Musica Britannica* comprehensively into the first quarter of the 17th century. (The other, Volume 102, includes material from the two virginal books in the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge.) The present edition contains music by anonymous and a dozen or so named composers, including the complete keyboard works of Nicholas Carleton, the surviving twenty 'Miserere' canons by Thomas Woodson, and the 'Pretty ways for young beginners to look on', possibly by Thomas Tomkins.

English Keyboard Music 1650–1695 ASK 134 PC6 Not yet fixed
 Edited as *Purcell Society Edition Companion Series* Volume 6 by Andrew Woolley. This wide-ranging anthology offers performers and scholars both a musical context for the keyboard works of Henry Purcell and a generous selection of fascinating repertoire from the period. The collection includes pieces by Blow, Bryne, Cobb, Draghi, Forcer, Hingeston, Locke and Anon., as well as a setting of Lully's *Scocca Pur*. Many of the fine works in this attractive collection are published here either for the first time or for the first time in a modern edition. (*Publication 2018*)

 Edited by Thurston Dart. 24 pieces selected and edited from the ms. in the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge, copied by Francis Tregian between 1609 and 1619.

Intabolutura Nova di Balli ASK 17 K23 £6.50
 Edited by Thurston Dart and William Oxenbury. A collection of 25 dances by Italian composers, originally printed in Venice, 1551. Transcribed from the copy in the Liceo Musicale, Bologna.

Jacobean Keyboard Music CON 253 K49 £8.75
 Anthology from *Musica Britannica* edited by Alan Brown. All eighteen pieces in this collection are reliably dated to the reign of James I, and whether by named composers or anonymous ones, appear in sources other than the notable virginal books preserved in the Fitzwilliam Museum, Cambridge. The contents demonstrate the variety of forms in the keyboard repertoire of this period, from plainsong-based compositions to dances, and the didactic introduction to contrapuntal techniques, the 'Pretty ways for young beginners to look on', possibly by Thomas Tomkins.

 A collection of 20 pieces by Froberger, Fischer and Strungk in the hand of John Blow, transcribed and edited from the ms. in the Brussels Conservatoire by Davitt Moroney.

Keyboard Music from Fitzwilliam Manuscripts ASK 141 MB102 £105.00
 Edited as *Musica Britannica* Volume 102 by Christopher Hogwood and Alan Brown. Complementary to *Musica Britannica* Volume 96, the 85 items in this edition complete the coverage of the Fitzwilliam Virginal Book in *Musica Britannica*. With the exception of four pieces by Sweelinck available elsewhere, this volume contains all the Fitzwilliam content not otherwise already published in individual *Musica Britannica* virginalist-composer collections or in the three anthology volumes (Volumes 1, 55 and 66). In addition, there are ten pieces from another important keyboard source in the collection of Cambridge's Fitzwilliam Museum, the Tisdale Virginal Book.

Keyboard Solos and Duets CON 254 K48 £8.75
 Edited by Alan Brown. Complementary to K49, this collection from *Musica Britannica* is a unique offering of music by John Amner, Nicholas Carleton and John Tomkins that is the only surviving keyboard music by the respective composers. In addition to a pair of duets, there are two lengthy variation sets, Amner's being a rare example of those on a metrical psalm or hymn-tune (possibly by Tallis in this case). Nicholas Carleton's 'A verse of 4 parts' and 'Upon the sharp' include several examples of unusual chromatic notation and wide-ranging tonal schemes.

 Transcribed and edited by Thurston Dart from Playford's original publication of 80 short pieces by the major composers of the mid-17th century.

Musick's Handmaid: The Second Part CON 108 K10 £7.50
 Transcribed and edited by Thurston Dart from the publication of 1689 of 35 easy pieces mostly by John Blow and Henry Purcell.

Parthenia CON 106 K19 £10.00
 Edited by Thurston Dart. A critical edition of the famous book first published in 1612–13, with 21 pieces by Byrd, Bull and Gibbons.

The Fingering of Virginal Music CON 103 K38 £7.50
 Edited by Peter le Huray. A selection of pieces including works by Byrd, Bull and Gibbons newly transcribed with the original fingerings given in the ms.

The 'Lynar' Virginal Book CON 224 K42 £8.00
 Twelve pieces by John Bull, Giles and Richard Farnaby, Orlando Gibbons, Leonhard Woodson and others are here collected to make an attractive anthology of English keyboard music found in the precious Lynar A manuscripts, which also contain primary sources for the keyboard music of Sweelinck, Peter Philips and Tarquinio Merula. The Mulliner Book ASK 23 MB1 £98.00
 New edition of *Musica Britannica* Volume 1 by John Caldwell
 This new edition of the publication that launched the *Musica Britannica* series in 1951 restores original note values to the music, and brings to the text the fruits of over half a century of continuing research and discovery stimulated by the pioneering edition of Denis Stevens. As far as possible, all significant notational features of the source are recorded in the transcription or the Textual Commentary. The volume now also includes music for cittern and gittern both in tablature and transcription, transcriptions of analogues, additional pieces, a detailed description of the manuscript, and music for the hymns and antiphons identified as melodic sources.

Morgan Hayes, born in 1973, is a leading contemporary composer for the piano. The scope of his work is broad, ranging from virtuoso solos such as *Puppet Theatre* and *Lute Stop* to brief celebratory miniatures like *Wigmore Hall* and *Birthday Capriccio*. *Strides* is an ongoing series of short character pieces of contrasting moods and styles, challenging the player, but well within the range of performers of intermediate technical ability.

Among the most famous of twentieth-century art songs, *Sea Fever* has been imaginatively recreated for solo piano by Roderick Williams, whose accomplishments as a master of English lieder are matched by a composer's ear for the latent potential of an existing work. In this case, the inspiration was the playing of the dedicatee, the notable British pianist Maria Marchant, and the suggestion of Bruce Phillips of the John Ireland Trust for a 'free arrangement' in the manner of Liszt. In fact, the new version remains true to the original while offering the performer a degree of poetical bravura by no means superfluous or transcendental. It could well be programmed with other piano music by John Ireland, or stand alone as a highly effective and instantly recognised encore. 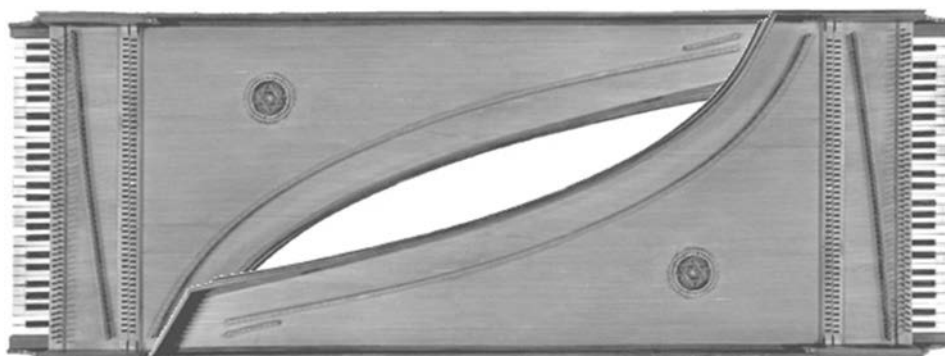

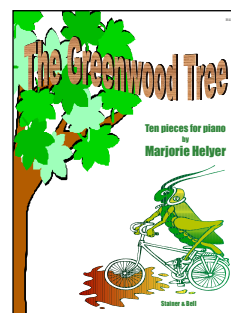

Easy under the fingers (and feet), this is a real player's piece and would suit any occasion where a little pomp and ceremony are required.

A lively march in military style frames a 'big tune' in E flat major, written in the grand ceremonial manner. 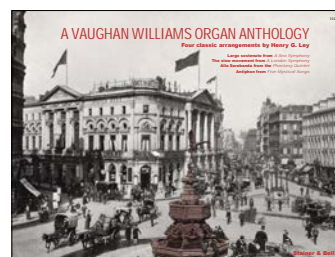

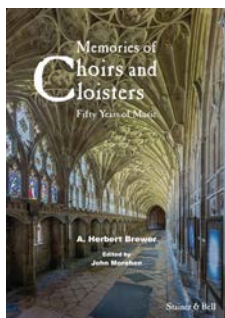

Light Organ Series

This is an ongoing showcase collection for organ pieces in the stylish 'light music' idiom that not only continues to enchant today's listeners and players, but also to fascinate contemporary composers. Complementary to the series, the memoirs of legendary performer Louis Mordish add a dash of colour in prose to the exotic sounds of his *Turkish Delight*, with fascinating insights into the life and times of a unique 20th-century musician.

Tart with the Cart is a playful variation on the song 'Cockles and Mussels', taking its title from the popular name for the celebrated life-size statue of Molly Malone in Dublin. The march *Animo et Fide* ('With courage and faith') was written in 2008 to commemorate the centenary of Stockport Town Hall, and is a processional in the tradition of those by Elgar, Walton and Eric Coates.

A rousing march, celebrating the installation of the mighty Wurlitzer theatre organ from the Gaumont (Granada) Cinema, Manchester in 'Projections' – formerly part of the Studio Tours Complex.

Malcolm ARCHER

Sleigh Bells Across the Snow H466 £4.75
In the tracks of such masterful sleigh rides as those of Leroy Anderson, Malcolm Archer's *Sleigh Bells Across the Snow* comes with optional chimes and a memorable tune. Though conceived with the theatre organ in mind, it works equally well on any instrument with at least two manuals and pedals, and should be performed with lots of verve and as much glissandi and embellishment as take the performer's fancy.

The Royal Standard H477 £4.75
Written to celebrate the year of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and the London Olympics, Malcolm Archer's march for organ takes its title from the famous emblem of royalty that flies proudly over Buckingham Palace when the sovereign is in residence. Befitting its subject, this uplifting music is in the high ceremonial style of Elgar and Walton, as colourful as the royal banner in blue, red and gold, but with a modern flavour too in its syncopated main theme. The piece is of intermediate standard, and is suitable for a variety of instruments with two manuals and pedals.

Ena BAGA

Bagatelle. Arranged by John Norris H345 £4.50
An outstanding performer from the days of silent cinema, pianist Ena Baga was also the gifted composer of many short pieces that fall into the category of 'light music'. *Bagatelle* was used as her signature tune whilst organist at the famous Tower Ballroom, Blackpool.

George BLACKMORE

Old Glory. ATOS Convention March H429 £4.75
This all-American march-medley aptly takes its name from the unofficial title for the United States' flag. *Old Glory* is published as a tribute to George Blackmore, a fine player and composer who did much to encourage a revival of interest in the 20th-century theatre organ.

Joe MARSH

Two Marches: Victory Parade and New Victoria H493 £6.50
This matching pair of stirring marches is the latest addition to Stainer & Bell's popular 'Light Organ' series. Joe Marsh writes with a particular flair for rhythmic heft and swing, and his work shows the great British tradition of martial music for the instrument alive and thriving in the hands of one of its most noted practitioners, who is also President of the Sunderland Theatre Organ Preservation Society.

Saints on a Spree is a stylish and not altogether reverent fantasy on several popular tunes associated with saintliness. Lively episodes in Latin-American and schmalzty-waltz mood pull the carpet from under a solemn, hymn-like opening. Things get even more wild when Widor's Toccata from the Fifth Symphony and Brahms' *Lullaby* put in an appearance. But just in time the composer draws all these ideas into a grand and saintly peroration, which will sound as good whether played on an electronic instrument or on a church organ.

Scherzo for the White Rabbit H348 £4.50
Host of BBC radio's 'The Organist Entertains', Nigel Ogden is a celebrity recitalist and a stylish composer. He has performed extensively throughout the UK and the Continent.

Haydn WOOD

Slumber Song H469 £3.75
Reissued to mark the 50th anniversary of Haydn Wood's death, the refined and distinctive *Slumber Song* displays the remarkable talent of this master of light music, the composer of *Roses of Picardy*, *A Brown Bird Singing*, and *Bird of Love Divine*, as well as of a distinguished list of works for the concert hall. Arranged for organ by J. A. Meale.

Stanley WYLLIE

North of the Border H364 £4.50
You don't have to be Scottish to admire this lively march from Stanley Wyllie, distinguished cinema-organist and composer who died in 2003. The main theme hints at several popular tunes, but retains its own individuality. A flowing trio complements the energetic outer sections.

Louis MORDISH

So I Think I'll Become a Musician B808 £9.25
An Autobiography in Nine Movements
This is the life-story of an outstanding performer from the golden age of cinema organ, who was a much-loved musician and a member of the prestigious Claridge's Orchestra. Louis, who died in 1996, did practically all there was to do in showbiz since joining the profession as a pianist for the silent screen. There's a special emphasis on the mighty Wurlitzers and other instruments that he played to perfection. Eight pages of photographs set the scene for an experience of pure entertainment from cover to cover.

'Specially prepared for candidates for the various musical examinations', over 60 years ago, this clear little handbook remains a remarkably complete guide to the elements of music and good practice in its notation.

Another classic book in English for all beginning to learn to read music. The 'rudiments' of music-reading do not change, but the book has been thoroughly revised to reflect new attitudes to teaching them.

Harmony and Counterpoint

Alan BUSH

Strict Counterpoint in the Palestrina Style 15004 £6.80
A lucid and practical guide to two-part Species Counterpoint. 55 exercises complete with worked examples.

Stewart MACPHERSON

Form in Music B237 £10.25
Basic descriptions of the main musical form used in music from the simplest phrase construction of folk tunes to the complexities of sonata form in the 19th century, with 150 musical examples from different works. This book is still basic to any analytical study for beginners.

Composition and Improvisation

Laura CAMPBELL

Sketching at the Keyboard B605 £14.45
Laura Campbell was a pioneering teacher of keyboard skills, with a special gift to inspire a practical understanding and application of harmony in her pupils. Much praised and reprinted since its publication in 1982, *Sketching at the Keyboard* is the epitome of her method, and remains unrivalled for its systematic treatment of this challenging yet rewarding subject. Through the concept of 'landscaping', the student develops a command of textural variation and of the enrichment and extension of primary harmonies. Complementary to *Sketching at the Keyboard* but valid equally for use in conjunction with it or independently, *Sketches for Improvisation* is a step-by-step guide to mastery of the subject that also promotes written skills through the creation of a portfolio of compositions. Eight jazzy pieces for piano with CD accompaniment and tips on improvisation and chords. Written to encourage the development of improvisational skills, *Piano Grooves* is for players who've had a basic classical training, but now feel they'd like to work in jazz and popular styles. The eight pieces range from Blues to Bossa, from Funk to Romantic Ballad. With their CD accompaniments (in addition to full recorded performances) you can be your own soloist, with backing band, drums, bass guitar and strings. A professional performer, composer and songwriter, and a regular contributor to *Music Teacher* and other music journals, Tony Cliff writes clearly and concisely, both in words and in music. His tips, guidance, targets and helping hand offer players a maximum of musical enjoyment with a minimum of theoretical fog.

Practical Jazz stands as an eloquent tribute to the work of Lionel Grigson, for many years Professor of Harmony and Improvisation at London's Guildhall School of Music & Drama. A usable theory of the subject that grows naturally out of practical experience yet is understandable in classical terms, it is an ideal guide for students who have a natural feeling for jazz but find conventional harmony tuition to be dull and academic. Rapid progress is made from simple jazz chords in various voicings to the 12-bar blues and its variations. Part 1 gives the harmonic underpinning for improvising melody over the changes clearly explained in Part 2 – from blues to bebop. Equally suited to the amateur enthusiast, this book makes an important contribution to jazz education, fulfilling the requirements both of the National Curriculum and more advanced studies at college or university.

Creative Jazz Education B778 £17.50
A Course Book with accompanying audio CD
This well-established publication introduces small band jazz groups, both vocal and instrumental, to the simplest improvisatory techniques at the heart of jazz. Around 150 music examples and exercises for group and class work with an explanatory text to help the music teacher, classically trained or brought up as a jazz player. The authors have the widest experience in Britain of taking jazz workshops and teaching regularly in school curricula. Both are contributors to Stainer & Bell's *Small Band Jazz* series. The Art of Practice

Robert GERLE

The Art of Practising the Violin B506 £11.75
One of America's outstanding violin teachers, and a highly regarded recording and concert artist, Robert Gerle studied at the Liszt Academy in Budapest with Geza de Kresz, and numbered Flesch, Thibaud and Enescu among his principal influences. Good bowing and intonation, left-hand practice, sight-reading and memory training are the focus of *The Art of Practising the Violin*, in which he brought his great depth of practical wisdom to bear on issues that are of concern for *all* string players.

Complementary to *The Art of Practising the Violin*, *The Art of Bowing Practice* is a detailed study of right-hand technique which matches artistic problems with technical solutions, and shows how the mechanics of the bowing arm, and the holding and moving of the bow, relate directly to aspects of fine tone, phrasing and articulation.

Jeffrey WHITTON

The Art of Practising the Piano B806 £11.25
The book is intended for piano students who have reached Grade 5 and then need help with the organisation of their practice rather than simply repetitive playing of scales and pieces. Imaginatively presented, the author writes of physical and psychological preparation; practice by analysis; the development of a secure memory; how to approach sight-reading; practising scales, exercises and pieces by identifying problem areas; and preparation for performance. Whatever techniques you are taught to use, this book is an immensely useful aid to making practice pleasurable rather than dull, never mindless and always a stimulating voyage of discovery.

ALVIN, Juliette

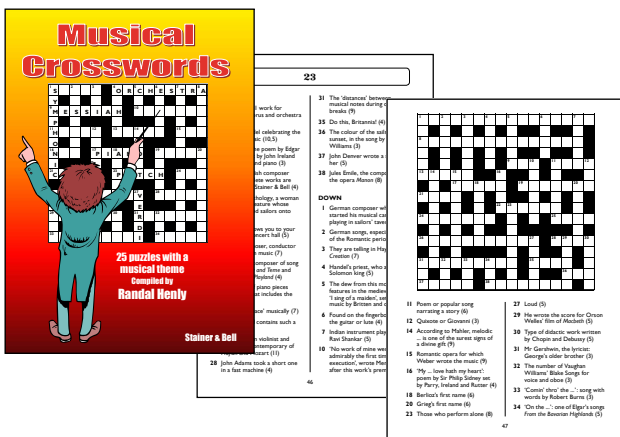

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The Royal Albert Hall, Kensington, London, England

The official title of the structure, opened by Queen Victoria on 29th March 1871, was The Royal Albert Hall of Arts and Sciences, and the building has been used for a rich variety of functions over the years. For instance, the explorer Stanley lectured here to the Royal Geographical Society in 1890; it was used as a cinema in 1905; the Bolshoi Ballet gave the first of many performances in 1960; tennis was played here in 1970; there was ice-skating with John Curry in 1984; and in 1991 sumo wrestling was held – the first time in 1,500 years that a grand basho had been held outside Japan.

This incredibly versatile space hosts over 330 events every year and is celebrated for its legendary performances. On 14th April 1923, the BBC broadcast a recital by contralto Lily Payling, while in October 1950, a concert was given by the Trapp Family Singers (of *The Sound of Music* fame). The world-famous Henry Wood Promenade Concerts have been held in the hall since 1941 following the destruction of the Queen's Hall in an air raid.

The 'Father' Willis organ, with four manuals and 111 stops was, at its opening, the largest in the world, with the wind pressure being supplied by steam engines in the basement. With later additions in the 20th century, and a complete refurbishment in the early years of the 21st century, the organ is again the largest in the UK with 147 stops and 9997 speaking pipes, reclaiming its title from the Willis organ in Liverpool's Anglican Cathedral.



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
